Christmas will soon be here with us. Families, friends, acquaintances, all of us, will be preparing for this event so great that almost every nation celebrates it.


This time of year, which brings people of all origins together, brings us all, I believe, a wind of love, generosity and sharing.

NEWS FROM P'TIT BONHEUR



The P'tit Bonheur's main goal is to enable parents to experience parenthood in a natural and harmonious way, while maintaining good physical and mental health.

Target clientele

Families with children aged 0 to 6 between Saint-Siméon to Port-Daniel.

Who attends the P'tit Bonheur?

- A pregnant mother or one who has just given birth;
- Parents who lack sleep, because their baby has decided to keep them awake or because they have an ear infection;
- A dad who supports his partner as best he can, because it's their first child;
- A family of 3 children, who must purchase 3 snowsuits, 3 pairs of mittens, 3 pairs of boots, etc.;
- All answers are correct.

When can they take advantage of P'tit bonheur's services?

- ▼ When it takes \$20 to buy milk and bread when her wage is \$15.25 an hour;
- When unemployment is late because of an administrative issue;
- When Mom can't remember when she had a moment to relax in the bath;
- When your couch has become the place where you put the clothes you took out of the dryer a few days ago;
- When you envy the tiredness of people who say they're tired, even though they don't have children;
- When parents feel isolated because their families live 3 hours away.
- When you feel the need. Don't wait too long.

In short, the examples are endless. Now there's no reason to deprive yourself of the P'tit Bonheur's services.



Did you know that a car seat for a baby up to 20 pounds costs between \$100 and \$400? At Le P'tit Bonheur, you can rent one for a small fee. There's plenty of other equipment to rent, too. Services are free.

TAX CREDIT AND INFORMATIONS FOR CAREGIVERS



Did you know you can receive a tax credit if you are a caregiver living with a person 70 or over, without an impairment and who is not your spouse?

You may be able to claim a \$1,299 tax credit if you meet the following conditions:

- ⇒ You lived with a care receiver (not your spouse) 70 or over without an impairment.
- ⇒ You lived with the care receiver in a dwelling of which you, your spouse (if he or she also lived with you), the care receiver or the care receiver's spouse (if he or she also lived with you) was an owner, tenant or subtenant.
- ⇒ You lived with the care receiver for at least 365 consecutive days, including at least 183 days in 2022.
- ⇒ The care receiver lived in Canada the entire time you lived with them.

The employer can find a lot of interesting informations on this website because did you know ...

- ⇒ 1 of 3 staff member is a caregiver;
- ⇒ 1 of 2 staff member will have to take a leave of absence 8 at 9 days each year to take care of someone close;
- \Rightarrow 56% of the caregivers are workers;
- ⇒ You can ask the caregiver working for you for a medical paper by a professional.
